STANDING RULES 2020-2022

- 1. Women who reside within the historical boundaries of Sun City West are eligible for membership. A SCW Recreation Card is not necessary.
- 2. All prospective Members are to be referred to the Membership Director.
- 3. Membership dues (of \$20.00) are renewable beginning in November and are delinquent after December 31st. Delinquent dues will result in a penalty fee of \$3.00.
- 4. All Members are entitled to receive a Membership Directory.
- 5. The General Monthly Luncheon Meetings are the second (2nd) Thursday of each month at 11:00 A.M. at Anacapa Restaurant in Corte Bella.
- 6. Should the need arise that the General Monthly Luncheon Meetings need to find a new venue, this can be done by the President and or the Board for the betterment of the whole.
- Your General Monthly Luncheon check of \$20.00 is your reservation. Checks written in an amount covering more than one person are not acceptable. Any special needs entrée (vegetarian or gluten free) must be noted in the memo section of the check. Checks of \$25.00 written for guests must indicate your guests' name in check memo section. Mail checks to Connections, P. O. Box 5314, SCW <u>85376.</u>
- 8. The deadline for cancelling your luncheon reservation is 6:00 P.M. the Saturday prior to the luncheon. Speak with the Luncheon Reservations Director or assistant or leave a voice mail.
- 9. Special seating needs must be addressed to the Luncheon Reservations Director at the time of the reservation.
- 10. A local female guest may attend two General Monthly Luncheon Meetings; thereafter, membership is required. There is no restriction on out-of-town guests.
- 11. Board Meetings are usually held the first (1st) Thursday of each month from September through May (excluding December).
- 12. Any member needing to attend a Board Meeting is to notify the president.
- 13. Local guests may participate in only one social activity twice before joining Connections.

Standing Rules are used by an organization to administer its affairs under the provision of the organization's Bylaws. Standing rules are more flexible than Bylaws and may be changed at any time as needed. The purpose of parliamentary procedures is to make sure that members' rights are not violated.
